Meeting called to order: 7:06pm

Argyle Replacement Plan

Presented by **Franci Stratton -** School Trustee and liaison for the Argyle family of schools.

FS confirmed that the Argyle rebuild has been on the ministry plan since 2005 due to the need for seismic upgrades. The rebuild is the top priority for the district.

In 2012 the Ministry designated seismic funding. The funds allocated are 39.5 million.

For an extra 7.9 million the district can build a new school but the district has to find the cost difference.

The district investigated the sale of surplus property. The Board of Education went ahead in identifying schools that will not be needed in the future and made sales accordingly.

After public consultation, the district sold **Keith Lynn School** and **Mount Royal Elementary**. Intend to sell **Ridgeway Annex**. The fourth reading takes place this Monday, 26 Oct, 2015 in front of city council.

Financial requirements have been met, as long as the Ridgeway sale goes through.

The Board hopes that the project agreement will be signed by the end of this school year.

Estimates suggest that the building process takes four years from design to build so the **school would open 2019**.

Cost has escalated to \$51.5 million to allow for extra capacity. The sale of property can cover this cost increase.

The hope is that the Ministry won't order a seismic upgrade and that the rebuild will proceed.

Questions from the Floor:

Is the only opposition to the rebuild due to cost?

FS: Opposition stemmed from the district's decisions to sell property. Otherwise there has not been opposition to the rebuild.

Where will the kids be placed during the rebuild?

FS: The kids will remain in the school and the new school will be built on the playing fields. That does present complications in terms of neighbourhood impact, which will have to be addressed prior to the rebuild.

Does the district have the funds or not?

FS: As long as the Ridgeway sale goes through the district has the funds. It is at fourth reading, which is usually little more than a formality. Treasury has no reason to turn it down that FS can see.

Can you speak to the parcel of land around Braemar school, which has been an issue?

FS: The school district saw a piece of land which was not needed by Braemar school, now or in the long term. It could cover extras, such as an artificial turf field. The sale would produce 2.4 million.

FS: A small group is opposed to the sale. They have raised environmental issues and issues related to traffic. The building project has presented changes to address traffic issues and a permit to build 4 homes. The land would never be cleared for school use.

Is this information posted anywhere?

FS: Information is available on the school district website sd44.ca land, learning and liveability update.

Will there be an artificial turf field?

FS: The Ministry provides funds for a gravel field only. The district wants more all-weather fields. Will need to be funded in addition to the rebuild budget. Money from the sale of the Braemar land would contribute funds.

Principal's Report

Reminder to all parents that they can contact administration about Argyle.

Introduction of Susan Owens, new vice-principal.

Susan thanked the school community for a warm welcome and outlined her responsibilities.

She taught in Langley for many years and is continuing to teach at Ross Road.

Update

Thank you to parents for the **projectors**. All classrooms, plus the music room and the library, have projectors and new screens. The teachers greatly appreciate having them.

Thank you to the parents who offered to buy new cross country and track and field in smaller sizes.

Appreciate all the volunteering that parents provide.

Student vote. The four Federal candidates came to speak to the students prior to the election. Government is part of the Grade 5 curriculum but all the intermediate students have had some discussion recently. Ross Road ran a student vote. Organised by Angela Tancon and Marie McCallister. The Green party won!

The space at the back of the school is currently being rented to a **film production**. They are donating money in addition to rental fee of which the school retains 25%. It has been a positive experience and it has been good for the children.

Monday Message. The newsletter has ended but the MM is intended to replace as a communication to parents. Parents appreciate the update. There have been some issues with the new computer system.

Driving and Parking. Please follow the one way rules and the parking restrictions. Important for our neighbours on Allen that it isn't used as a turning circle.

Band. Karen Koch is off until Christmas. John Rogers is filling in temporarily. There is now a posting for the position until Christmas. John is applying.

Vicki Thomas will be off for medical reasons for several more weeks. Trying to keep TOC consistency.

Questions

Nut aware issue. Can we share again with the school community the need to be nut aware?

Carla will include in the Monday Message a reminder about school nut policy.

Nuts cannot be taken into shared spaces or classes with children with allergies.

Is there a reason RR doesn't have after school care?

RR does not have the space to offer after school care. Other schools have a dedicated area.

Is it possible to get another classroom? I would rather pay to send my child to care here.

After school care is run privately so it is separate from the school district so the school would not initiate.

Vice-principal's Update

Student leadership. Important, especially at the grade 6/7 level. Several students participated in **WE day**, having raised funds for North Shore Search and Rescue.

Grade 7s and 6s are lunch time monitors in the primary classrooms.

Grade 7s and 6s are also assisting with valet.

Classroom ambassadors are being asked to help with set up for events, also taken from older grades.

Grade 7s have the opportunity to play basketball again but some parents are working with grade 6s who are interested.

Ouestions

What's going on with all the stuff on the stage?

SO: The stuff on the stage is because of a district program called clear the clutter. Designed to clear unwanted/broken clutter from schools. Currently looking at what is salvageable or needs particular recycling. There is a delay in the district collecting the unwanted items.

Safeteen

Wed Nov 18^{th} , 2015 . Anti-bullying and violence prevention program started in BC. For children in grade 6/7.

Endorsed by the BCTF and several school districts.

Helps teens develop skills to cope with challenging situations.

Great feedback from previous workshops.

3 hour workshops presented in gender separate workshops.

PAC wants this to continue every two years.

Tue 17 November 7:00pm Parent night. Opportunity for parents to hear about the program.

The cost has increased due to additional students coming to RR over the summer.

Total cost is \$2,336. The PAC couldn't justify that sum of money for 2 grades. Lene undertook to find funds.

\$1,575 donation from Polygon Homes.

A RR parent donated \$500 anonymously for the program.

This left a shortfall of approximately \$250 which the PAC is contributing from the speakers' budget.

Jesse Miller will be presenting on how students use and communicate over social media websites and applications with the sole purpose of producing smart, aware and ethical social media participants who communicate an effective and positive message and build an online reputation that will help students into the next stages of life.

Tennis BC

This year is a sports theme. \$5000 has been allocated to fund. The tennis program will take place over three weeks April 4-22, 2016. Each class will get 4 sessions as part of the curriculum. The event will take place in the gym.

The district assessed the laptops and confirmed it is worth spending.

PAC Exec has suggested to support the sport program this year by purchasing more **soccer balls** for the classes with the above donation.

Grade 4/5 children raised \$112 at a bake sale to raise money for sport equipment which can also be used to purchase the soccer balls.

A parent donated the cost difference for the Safeteen program.

Play First

Program that some parents really support. The idea is to introduce recess play before lunch to help kids eat a more complete lunch and be able to focus more in the afternoon. PAC in liaison with the school administration.

Biggest road block for the primary classrooms. While the children are playing the teacher cleans up and preps for the afternoon for 1pm start. Teachers concerned that they cannot adequately prepare the classroom for afternoon lessons.

Teachers open to exploring how it is addressed in other schools.

Parent suggested that parent volunteers could help with the clean-up.

Idea is that children will sit more calmly if they run around first and then eat.

Q What happens if the children are still eating at 1 when school starts?

At Ridgeway they moved music appreciation to the start of the afternoon to give a few more minutes and children will be accommodated. There are ways to address issues.
