Denise began by acknowledging and thanking the Coast Salish people whose traditional territory North Vancouver School District resides on. She expressed our gratitude to the Squamish Nation and Tsleil Waututh Nation and we value the opportunity to learn, live and share educational experiences on this traditional territory.

#### 1. Welcome and Call to Order

- a. Denise called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM.
- b. The meeting agenda was accepted by the majority as presented at 7:05 PM.
- c. Motion to approve the May 20, 2021, annual general meeting minutes as presented by Denise was unanimously accepted at 7:06 PM.

#### 2. PAC Chair Update (Denise)

- a. Denise gave a brief overview on the purpose of the PAC.
- b. PAC Fundraising
  - MunchaLunch
  - o Art Card Project kids have finished art and information has gone out to parents.
  - Winter Fundraising Poinsettias and Purdy's chocolates
  - Spirit Wear
  - Ongoing Fundraisers (percentage of sales comes back to the PAC) Well Fed, MaxFruit, Two Rivers Meats, Oliver's Labels, Cobs Bread, and Moojoes Reflective Gear

#### 3. Administration Update (Kate Lechleiter and Bridget O'Brien-Kopacek)

a. The administration update is attached as an addendum to these minutes.

#### 4. Financial Report (Dorina)

- a. "Profit & Loss" statement and the "Balance Statement" are attached as an addendum to these minutes.
- b. Dorina noted that we have accrued expenses of \$6,388.41. The majority of this amount is allocated from the prior school year (\$5,000) and was allocated for a pottery class that we couldn't offer due to COVID-19. Kate explained that if a pottery class is not possible due to COVID-19 considerations, she would investigate a virtual session or something that can be done outside that would likely be PE focused as the best possible options in light of COVID-19 considerations. The PAC confirmed that Kate and Bridget will move forward with planning for the \$5,000 for a special learning opportunity for students this school year.
- c. Denise explained that in the past, the PAC has approved the teachers wish list at the AGM at the end of the school year. With the PAC fundraising success last school year, we wanted to purchase teacher wish list items earlier in the school year so that the families that helped raised the funds would also benefit from them. The budget expenditures for voting are:
  - 1. MacBook Laptops x 10 (cost \$10,190) majority voted in favour
  - 2. Rainbow Tables x 5 (cost \$2,800) majority voted in favour
  - 3. Classroom Physical Education (PE) Equipment (cost \$5,000) majority voted in favour
  - 4. Classroom Learning Tools (cost \$2,500) - majority voted in favour
  - 5. Document Cameras (cost \$400) - majority voted in favour
  - 6. Chair Slippers/Hushh-ups (cost \$5,500) - majority voted in favour
  - 7. Physical Education (PE) Equipment for Gym (\$1,000) - majority voted in favour
  - 8. FM Systems (cost \$3,000) - majority voted in favour
  - 9. Learning Assistance Class (LAC) iPads and Covers x 4 (cost \$2,000) majority voted in favour

#### 5. North Vancouver Parent Advisory Council (NVPAC) Update (Alana)

 Please click <u>here</u> for BC PAC President Andrea Sinclair's presentation to NVPAC last week. A takeaway from the meeting is that there is no master list of emails for parents from across the province for COVID-19 updates.

#### 6. North Shore Safety Council (NSSC) (Alana)

- The first North Shore Safety Council Meeting is tomorrow, November 4, 2021, and Alana asked for feedback from the PAC on health and safety strategies regarding traffic. Denise has a visual from the RCMP that explains how to help with parking and traffic safety that she is investigating having donated to be made into a sandwich board. Kate raised that she would like the traffic cones to be out all day but the challenge is who would bring them in at the end of the day. Alana to ask at the meeting for recommendations. Kate also confirmed that the cones can be kept in the school and she has spoken to Valet Coordinator, Ed Lathioor, regarding this.

## 7. Canadian Parents for French (CPF) Update (Alana)

- The next meeting is November 4, 2021, and Alana will reach out to Kate on the sociocultural grants.

#### 8. New Business

- Beck asked if it was possible to have student volunteers for the valet. Kate
  answered that new training that is required for students to volunteer and it requires a
  significant amount of training and coordination. Alana to bring forward at NSSC
  meeting.
- Dorina asked whether the lunch monitors program will be coming back. Kate explained that due to COVID-19 this was suspended but following recent communications from Superintendent regarding these restrictions, they are now working through logistics right now to be able to implement student lunch monitors again.
- Nikki asked if the library furniture that was ordered last year has been delivered. Kate confirmed that it was delivered last year and the students are enjoying the new leather couches, they look great, and are easy to keep clean.
- Dorina asked about whether parents would be allowed in the classrooms again to volunteer with reading and Kate confirmed that this will be a longer process due to COVID-19 considerations.

Families will be able to book a conference to meet with their child's classroom teacher **before** report cards are published in December. This conference provides an opportunity for students, parents/guardians to collectively reflect on student learning early in the year. The emphasis is on goal-setting and student self-reflection. **Early dismissal dates are Nov 16, 17, and 18 at 1:50pm**.

Please read the attached letter that provides step-by-step instructions on how to sign up. If you cannot make any of the times your child's teachers has scheduled, please contact the teacher directly by email. Sign-up will close on **Sunday Nov 14**. After that time, you will need to contact your child's

teacher directly. We are able to have in-person meetings. Teachers may offer in-person, virtual or a hybrid model. Your child's classroom teacher will provide more specific details on what to expect and how to prepare. How to prepare for a conference:

- Ask your child what they love about school, what is going well, and what they feel particularly proud of
- Ask them what things are harder and what strategies they are using to deal with those areas that require further growth
- Finally, set a goal with your child
- For any in-person meetings please use the outside classroom door to enter/exit, wear a mask and complete the daily health check (QR code) (for an upstairs classroom, adults may enter and exit at the main entrance)
